





## Gamma Phi Delta Foundation, Inc. Lyndia Grant, President 2018-2019

#### **GPD Foundation**

Dr. Willie B. Kennedy served the city and county of San Francisco as a member of the Board of Supervisors. The Willie B. Kennedy Apartments, a 98-unit senior housing complex, is in San Francisco and was named after Dr. Kennedy as a longtime San Francisco supervisor. Dr. Kennedy championed minority-owned and womenowned businesses and worked tirelessly for improvements to the Bayview-Hunters Point neighborhood.

The Gamma Phi Delta Foundation honors the legacy of its founder, the late Willie B. Kennedy, who passed away in 2013. Dr. Kennedy was a Life Member of Gamma Phi Delta Sorority, Inc., and rose through the ranks from sorority member to National President. In 1987, during her tenure as National President, Dr. Kennedy envisioned the idea to organize the Gamma Phi Delta Foundation. Established as a 501c3 in Michigan, the charter group of women worked closely with Dr. Kennedy to provide scholarships for the youth of Gamma Phi Delta Sorority. In addition, Dr. Kennedy developed school programs so the Foundation could provide tutoring, school supplies and ongoing support. The GPD Foundation hosted health fairs to educate the community about health problems that impact the community, including the devastating effects of HIV and AIDS. Today, the Foundation continues this collaboration with the National President and sorority.

The Gamma Phi Delta Foundation thanks each member for your continued support and special thank you to National President, Lenor Reese. The Foundation is extremely grateful!

#### **Events**

The newly elected Board of Directors of the Gamma Phi Delta Foundation, Inc. voted to implement two exciting projects to raise funds to purchase supplies for schools located in Indianapolis, Indiana.

#### Women's Legend Ball

The Women's Legend Ball is a biennial GPD Foundation fundraiser to take place at Boulé. The inaugural event was scheduled to take place on Wednesday, July 15, 2020 in the Crystal Ballroom during the 61<sup>st</sup> Boulé in Indianapolis, IN. However, due to COVID-19, it was cancelled and will be held during the 2022 Boulé in Atlanta, GA.

#### **National Raffle**

The National Raffle is a biennial GPD Foundation fundraiser that will take place at Boulé. The first raffle drawing is scheduled for Wednesday, July 15, 2020 during the Women's Legend Ball. Tickets may be purchased from any GPD Foundation board member and will be sold throughout the sorority year. Tickets cost \$5; prizes are: 1<sup>st</sup> place – \$300, 2<sup>st</sup> place – \$200 and 3<sup>st</sup> place – \$100. Though the Legends Ball was cancelled due to COVID-19, the Foundation held a virtual drawing.

#### Tree of Life

The Tree of Life is a simple fundraiser designed to support public schools with computers and supplies. A "leaf" costs \$265 and is purchased in honor, or memory, of someone. This is an opportunity for each leaf donor to display a lasting tribute with a special person's name engraved on the Gamma Phi Delta Foundation's Tree of Life. It hangs prominently in the Gamma Phi Delta Sorority National Headquarters in Detroit, Michigan. It was unveiled during the 2018 Boulé which was held in Detroit.

#### In Loving Memory Soror Phyllis Lewis Ponders

Phyllis Temple Lewis Ponders followed in the steps of her mentor and mother, **Dr. Violet Temple Lewis, the co-founder of Gamma Phi Delta Sorority, Incorporated**. Upon graduating from college, Phyllis was employed at Lewis Business College, and it was there that she became a member of Alpha Chapter. Remembering that in its infancy, Alpha Chapter was the only chapter of Phi Gamma Delta Sorority (our name was later changed); Phi Gamma Delta was an important student-based organization at **Lewis Business College**. She served as the chapter advisor for Alpha Chapter until 2006.

The sorority sponsored a number of social events at the college, which Dr. Lewis considered an important part of the collegiate experience. Phyllis Lewis organized a number of these activities from luncheons to formal evening events that had themes such as Spanish dances. Many of these activities also involved various area Divine Nine chapters. Phi Gamma Delta was a recognized name in the city of Detroit. **Artists of Tomorrow** (AOT) programs were a part of the early years of the sorority. Phyllis served on the committees that organized many of these AOT events which were held in the auditorium of the Detroit Institute of Arts.

Although Phyllis enjoyed being in the background while serving the sorority, she was the early Editor and Chief of Phi Gamma Delta. When national meetings were held, meeting minutes were organized and mimeographed, prepared for the meeting the following morning. That was a part of Phyllis' duties. During this time, Dr. Violet Lewis was the National Organizer for the sorority. She was driven to various cities where chapters were being started by a group of sorors that included Phyllis. From August 5, 1968 to October 31, 1977, Phyllis was the Resident Agent for Gamma Phi Delta Sorority. In 1992, Gamma Phi Delta Sorority, Incorporated honored her with the Rosepin Award recognizing her outstanding service to her community and beyond. In 1996, she was elected as a "Living Pearl," Gamma Phi Delta Sorority's highest honor commemorating her years of dedication and service.

Phyllis Lewis Ponders was a **Building Fund Life and Heritage Tile member**, chaired national and chapter Artist of Tomorrow, Founders' Day and the Children's Christmas parties over her lifetime. **Living the Lewis legacy**, she often entertained that National Board of Directors when they came to Detroit for various meetings. Throughout her lifetime, Phyllis always remained "true" to Alpha Chapter. Phyllis served in several leadership roles and was active in Gamma Phi Delta Sorority, Inc for over 73 years. Although all three of her daughters, Stefeyne and Violet Ponders and Shirley Ponders Fordum are/were members of Alpha Chapter. When you joined Alpha Chapter, you became one of 'her girls' and you very quickly joined the sorors in calling her Mother or some other name of affection. At national and regional meetings, she always wanted to sit with her girls. As she aged, the members of Alpha Chapter became very protective and she loved to see this. Nothing gave Phyllis Ponders more pleasure than seeing Alpha Chapter sorors telling Violet or Stefeyne "to let Mother talk for as long as she wants." Although her voice was silenced on **March 24, 2020**; her impact will be felt forever because she embodied the harmony, peace, refinement and culture advocated by Gamma Phi Delta Sorority, Incorporated.

## Honoring 10<sup>th</sup> National President and Living Pearl Bessye D. Long "A Rose Beyond the Wall"



Bessye D. Long inducted into the Iota Chapter of Gamma Phi Delta Sorority, Inc. in 1949. She remained active for more than 65 years. Her dedication to her beloved sorority was known to everyone who knew her. She gladly served wherever she was needed within the sorority. Mrs. Long took her assignments seriously and was dedicated to excellence.

She held numerous positions throughout her membership. Mrs. Long served as the National Financial Secretary for over 25 years. Her dedication to this position was legendary within the sorority. Based upon her dedicated service and numerous contributions, she was elected for the highest honor in Gamma Phi Delta Sorority, Inc., as a Living Pearl. In 2000, Mrs. Long was elected to the highest position in the sorority, National President, in which she served for a four-year term. In 2014, she was appointed to serve as the National Nominating Chairperson. She established the Literature Review Committee during her term as National President and during recent years she served as an Advisor.

Mrs. Long had a quiet, calm presence. However, she could be firm and resolute when it was necessary to "get the job done". Soror Long will be greatly missed by her dear Iota Chapter, her much beloved Mid-Western Region, and sorors across the country.



The entire chapter took a leave of absence in 2016/2017 to reassess their purpose, they became active 2017/2018 and reclaimed 1 soror – 9.09% increase





### The Far Western Region

Chapters throughout the Far Western Region gave scholarships to students ranging from \$500.00 to \$2,000 to deserving students in pursuit of further education. Hanna Wilson, Rosetta L. Wilkerson, Javien Sahaba each received a scholarship.

Numerous vendors were on hand to sell the beautiful Gamma Phi Delta paraphernalia including jewelry, clothing and other designed materials.




#### **Epsilon Beta Chapter**




